Lifeline Survivor Benefit

If you are a survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, or related crimes, Lifeline can help you stay connected.

Save up to \$9.25 a month on your phone, internet, or bundled service for up to six months.

The Lifeline program is a federal program that helps lower the monthly cost of your phone or internet service.

What are the program benefits?

You can get a survivor benefit for up to six months:

- Up to \$9.25/month on phone, internet, or bundled service
- Up to \$34.25/month if you live on qualifying Tribal lands

What do you need to know before applying as a survivor?

- You will need to provide documentation of an attempted line separation request, which you can get from your phone company
- You will be able to select how you want us to reach out to you
- Only a limited group of representatives will have access to your information

How can I qualify?

You can qualify through the survivor-specific criteria:

- If your household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (for example, \$64,300 for a family of four)
- If you or your child or dependent, are enrolled in one of these **government** assistance programs:
 - Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
 - Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch or School Breakfast Program, including enrollment at a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school or school district
 - Received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year

You can also qualify through the standard Lifeline criteria:

- If your household income is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (for example, \$43,403 for a family of four)
- If you, or your child or dependent, are enrolled in one of these **government** assistance programs:
 - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
 - Medicaid
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance
 - · Veterans Pension or Survivors Benefit
- If you live on Tribal lands and you, or your child or dependent, are enrolled in one of these **Tribal assistance programs**:
 - Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
 - Head Start (only households meeting the income qualifying standard)
 - Tribal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (Tribal TANF)
 - Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations

You will need proof that you asked your phone company to separate your mobile phone line from your abuser's. This is called a "line separation request." The email, text, or letter your phone company sends will be your proof. If you don't have documentation, you can still apply for the standard Lifeline benefit.

What happens when my sixmonth survivor benefit ends?

After six months, you may qualify for the standard Lifeline monthly benefit of up to \$9.25 off for internet or bundled service or up to \$5.25 off for phone (voice-only) service.
